At the Francophonie Summit, President Emmanuel Macron answered questions from journalists and in particular from TV5 Monde, in response to the evolution of the practice of the French language in countries other than France. President Emmanuel Macron replied: "Yes, we have come back to the decline of the French language in the world. The French language is spreading through the demography of certain countries which are in the Francophonie, but with real setbacks for decades you have to be lucid! In the Maghreb countries, French is spoken less than 20 or 30 years ago, it is a reality, because there was resistance of political origin, or by a way of wanting rehabilitate its language through the political path, and also because there was English, like an Esperanto with the desire to develop with this ease of use and where people have created a linguistic space where with a few words and an almost imperfect language and where we find ourselves between us and no one judges us and what makes the Francophonie .." explained the Head of State Macron to the French press (Source: TV5 Monde,)
